#### **Improved PE Facilities**



On 13<sup>th</sup> January, we took over the new full-size AstroTurf pitch at Egglescliffe. This has been fully funded by Vision Academy Learning Trust and will be an invaluable resource and facility for our PE department as well as the wider community.

From 21st February, this pitch will be available for hire by the local community through letting agents: VALT Enterprises. More information on this will follow in due course. We would like to thank Stockton Borough Council for supporting the school through this project and working alongside Notts Sport and CLS to ensure the school has outstanding facilities for future generations.

In early February, all year groups engaged in a wide range of activities for National Number Day, organised by our school's Maths coordinator, Mrs Sawdon. Children came dressed as professionals who use maths in their everyday jobs, and were tasked with explaining the elements of maths pertinent to their roles. They also engaged in a wide variety of challenges based on measure, geometry, number patterns and many other components of maths. It was great to see children truly understanding how applicable and crucial maths is to ensure that the world around us functions properly. Fun was had by all and it was great to see such high-level problem solving!

# **History: A Journey Through the Ages**

Children from Years 1-6 have worked exceptionally hard this half term as they have studied history-based Discovery Units. They have produced some fantastic writing linked to this Discovery work and are really enjoying our new Golden Threads model for the curriculum.

- In KS1, our Year 1 and Year 2 children have built Tudor housing as part of their study of the Great Fire of London. These models featured jettying first floors, and the children were fantastic in explaining how the conditions at the time (environmentally and architecturally) quite literally fanned the flames!
- In Year 3 and Year 4, the children made Mosaics inspired by the frescos of Fishbourne Palace while comparing the rule of different Roman emperors.
- In Y5 and Y6, children have studied the Shang Dynasty of China, producing music based on the
  pentatonic scale while being inspired by Emperor Tang as they designed their own bronze age
  city.

There was a range of activities throughout the school. Here are some of them:




















# Whinstone Primary School
