Because the Fayre begins at the end of the school day, three entrances will be open to everyone until 3:30pm:


- Entrance 1: Year 5/6 playground door

Well done to our Maths Stars!




Class 1L was our KS1 winner for best attendance in the first half term. They enjoyed a reward, which the class decided upon themselves, of a movie and hot chocolate.
